We could not find out if it could take black and white photos directly, but as it is quite sophisticated, we could not be absolutely sure. In any event, the general consensus was that it would be better to use the RAW setting and process the shots on a computer using editing software.

As it happens, the same member's old Lumix DMC-TZ6 was found to be quite capable of taking black and white, and various other shades from sepia to 'warm' and 'cool' shots, which was a pleasant surprise.

There followed some interesting general discussions on focussing techniques for different conditions.

9th December - 'Have Yourself a Wild Christmas' by Kevin Reynolds

Kevin started by explaining that the celebration of birthdays is a pagan custom for warding off evil spirits, dating back to ancient times. The Christmas celebration was more about welcoming Spring and the end of Winter, after the Solstice. Until Victorian times, when Charles Dickens wrote A Christmas Carol, Christmas Day on 25th December was a very low key event.

Kevin then described the origins of the plants often associated with Christmas, holly, ivy, mistletoe and, more recently, poinsettia, with lavish images and stories. The evergreen nature of these plants were reminiscent of the resurrection of Jesus. The Druids wore a crown of holly on their heads similar to the crown of thorns worn by Jesus at his crucifixion and the red berries symbolise the blood of Jesus. Bacchus, the Roman god of wine and intoxication, was often depicted wearing a wreath of ivy and was used as a cure for a 'hangover'. Kissing under hanging mistletoe has a link to fertility, vitality and love dating back to before 1700. Kevin then brought us up to date with the recent trend in giving a poinsettia plant as a Christmas gift. With red leaves shaped like a star (of Bethlehem) this Mexican 'weed' has been a massive commercial success. Finally, the Christmas tree the most popular festive plant, was first introduced in 1800 by Queen Charlotte, the German wife of King George III. Who would have guessed that these plants would have such a rich historical connection with pagan and Christian culture?

Kevin then revealed that, according to the Bible, no animals were present at the birth of Jesus, despite images of lambs, oxen, donkeys and camels on many Christmas cards. Hence, these were not featured much in Kevin's talk. However, the traditional fare of roast turkey or goose has a sound historical heritage, Henry VIII being the first to enjoy turkey at Christmas. Kevin then described the tradition of herding hundreds of turkeys long distances from farms to town markets. Their poor webbed feet even required protection with a coating of hot pitch and sand, and had to be fattened up to make them fit to sell! Kevin's stories gave us a fascinating insight into the origins of our modern commercial Christmas.

Tanya then hosted a quiz based on the topics of the year's talks whilst we tucked into mince pies, stollen and mulled wine. For our next meeting on 13th January Catrin Rutland will talk about 'Women in Science'.

Finally, the organising committee of Tanya, Lynda, Kurt, Bill and Paul wish all our group members a merry Happy Christmas.
